Message in a Bottle helps emergency services personnel to save valuable time in identifying an individual very quickly and knowing if they have any allergies or take special medication. Paramedics, police, fire-fighters and social services support Lions' life-saving initiative and know to look in the fridge when they see the Message in a Bottle stickers. The initiative provides peace of mind that prompt and appropriate medical assistance can be provided, and next of kin / emergency contacts can be notified.

A number of people within the village already have this scheme.

## Culworth in the last 100 years

It is interesting to look back at the history of the village we are lucky to call home. Jose Rowlings has put together a list of dates and developments, but there are gaps and uncertainties, so if anyone can correct or add to the list, please get in touch with her on 01295760571 or josephine.rowling@gmail.com

- 1. Mumfords' Butchers shop established 1925
- 2. War Memorial erected about 1922. Old Auctioneers seat moved onto the village green
- 3. Village Hall erected about 1938 on land owned by Hill family
- 4. Primary School developed though first established in 1789
- 5. No railway line since 1963

6. Moravian Chapel in High Street built in 1810 disused by 1950's, became a scout hut then converted to a property in early 1960's

- 7. Greenhouses and orchard of Danvers House sold off. Now Culworth Court
- 8. Parish rooms demolished about 1972 to allow new Rectory to be built
- 9. Wheelwrights became a builders' yard, then engineering works which ceased in 2007
- 10. Building became an art gallery now Coffee Shop

11. Post Office was once at Dial House then Old Bakehouse before locating in Banbury Lane. This became a carpet shop and later closed – but when?

- 12. Culworth House became a Nursing Home in 1988, which closed in 2019
- 13. 5 retirement cottages built in the walled garden of Culworth House in ?
- 14. Barley Hill built in two sections numbers 1-6 then much later 7-31 from open fields
- 15. Butts Close built on land from Hill family sometime before 1939

16. Walnut Close of 8 properties started in July 1987 from open piece of land with old Walnut Tree in centre

17. Petrol filling station became Beech House in 1980's

18. Baptist Chapel on Village Green closed. Property demolished to be replaced by modern house retaining graves in garden.

19. Allotment gardens at back of the Manor House ceased in 1960s

20. Three properties built on land opposite Culworth Engineering in late 1960's. Used an iron frame

21. Wheatsheaf Public House became a dwelling

22. Other public houses (apart from Red Lion) closed. Red Lion now has Barn which is a delicatessen.

23. Farms – Paddocks, Gate House Farm, Westhill, Wheatsheaf, Fulford, Happylands now Culworth House Farm, all ceased.

24. Existing farm - Culworth Grounds and Westhill relocated to Chipping Warden Road, Blackbird Hill Farm

- 25. Village shop on the Green to rear of War Memorial ceased in 1990's
- 26. Shops now:

a. Mumford's Butchers, which supplies not only meat but fruit and vegetables, dry goods, kindling, frozen and chilled foods. Vans tour not only Culworth but many other villages. Noted for its sausages. Open 6 days a week

b. Red Lion Barn - delicatessen and gifts

c. Forge Coffee - milk, eggs, pies pasties, cakes - Open 7 days a week

- 27. New burial ground within Churchyard about 1935
- 28. New burial ground run by Parish Council from 1993
- 29. Archaeological dig 1991 and 1992 on Berry Hill Close
- 30. Mains water
- 31. Mains sewage and extension of sewage works
- 32. Undergrounding of electricity cables in centre of village 1993
- 33. Regular bus service ceased. Ability (request?) bus service
- 34. Major refurbishment of Church 1992 removing pews in South Aisle, creating a kitchenette.
- Relocating the font from within bell tower area to South aisle near door
- 35. Trees
  - a. many lost due to age
  - b. Oak tree planted on The Green for Queen Elizabeth Silver Jubilee
  - c. Oak tree in planted on Cricket Field near wall towards church for Queen Elizabeth Golden Jubilee
  - d. Millenium Oak in Berry Hill Close
  - e. Diamond Jubilee Wood down concrete road beyond old railway bridge. Mixed species planted by villagers and dedicated by Rev Brian Fairbank in 2014.
  - f. Platinum Jubilee Wood just before old railway bridge in concentric circle with centre oak in memory of HM The Queen gifted by HS2 in 2023
- 36. Cricket Field square and pitch levelled and relaid in 2023

## Location of Village Dog Bins

There are seven dog poo bins around Culworth. They are emptied weekly by the Parish Council at a cost to the council taxpayers of about £1000 annually. It therefore makes sense that responsible dog owners should make full use of the facility which is offered, rather than leaving mess uncollected or hanging it from the nearest bush for the Poo Fairy (who doesn't exist).

Just a reminder of the location of the dog poo bins:

- 1. The Banbury Lane end of the Cricket Field
- 2. The Concrete Road off Banbury Lane by the end of the Red Lion Footpath
- 3. Along the Concrete Road at the entrance to the footpath that goes through the "football" field to the High Street coming out at Paddocks Farm
- 4. In High Street by West Hill House, opposite Paddocks Farm
- 5. Off the Green at the back of the school by the allotment gate
- 6. At the corner of Sulgrave Road and Barley Hill
- 7. Along Sulgrave Road at the entrance to the footpath that goes across to Banbury Lane
