From evidencing the need in our initial survey monkey questionnaire over two years ago, attending fundraising events and providing personal donations to offering support to volunteering in the final stages, we thank you. None of this would be possible without our Parish Council offering their ongoing support, the land, and taking ownership of the facility moving forwards so that we can all benefit for many years to come.

It would be helpful if you could make a mental (or physical note) of how often you use the Community Park each week, what pieces of equipment you enjoy most and the difference it has made to your family's physical and emotional wellbeing. We will let you know via the usual means when and how to share your feedback.

Use of the Community Park area after dark is not permitted by children of any age. Children will be approached, and parents/guardians will be contacted if deemed necessary. This is to respect the nearby residences' right to a peaceful evening. Please explain this to your children so that they understand and ensure that you know where they are after dark. They are your responsibility.

Our under 9s have competed in two kwik cricket tournaments, the first one we hosted and although there was a cold wind, was sunny and very well attended with three visiting teams joining our team in a round robin tournament.

Our under 11's have continued to improve during the season and are currently unbeaten beating big cricketing clubs such as Brackley and Middleton Cheney. The most recent win was against Spencer Bruerne who we lost by 50 runs at the start of the season, but last week we won by 70 runs which goes to show the improvement the team has made. They have a couple more matches and intend to continue netting during the summer holidays.



Our men's team have had some good matches against Blakesley and Eydon and we had a very nice afternoon playing against a Presidents X1.

The new wicket, after a lot of very hard work from John Pritchett, Justin Thurgood, Joe Cox, my son and myself has played very well. The nets have also been a good addition and have been the reason for at least half a dozen new members to the club. It is just a shame about the amount of rubbish we are having to clear up from the nets before we can use them each time. Rubbish includes broken glass beer bottles, cigarettes and vodka

Thank you for inviting me to become your Rector. I do hope over the next few weeks and months we can become better acquainted. Here are a few bits of information about me.

I was born in Redditch, then lived at my aunt's village shop in Marston Green with my mother, and aunt and uncle's family. When I was three, my mother took a job as housekeeper, and we moved to Kings Norton. At the age of ten, we moved again to my grandmother's in Northampton, leaving St Martins in the Bull Ring, and joining St Albans, and Broadmead Baptist Church. I went to Sunday School with my new friends. We heard amazing bible stories, which we used to read after school, sitting on our doorsteps. We learnt the verses ready for the next Sunday. I joined St Albans Choir, and the Youth Club. I was fortunate to attend Northampton School for Girls, I loved sport, maths, and RE. Maths helped me through my working life. Sport and Church have given me lasting friendships and a lot of joy.

My interest in God paved the way for the rest of my life. I wasn't confirmed until I was 26. I always asked questions, at school, and after church, I would corner the minister, to question what he meant by '....?' I knew the Bible Stories, but I needed to get more understanding, and then after many discussions with the vicar at Sywell, where I lived, my two children were baptised, and my faith grew in a God who loved me, for who I was, and knew everything about me. I realised that God sent His Son to show me how to live, how to be kind, how to love, and then he died to give Me eternal life! WOW!

We moved back to Spinney Hill, then Spratton and East Haddon, where the Vicar asked me to 'type his letters'! The PCC beckoned. I became Treasurer. The Vicar retired. I was appointed Church Warden. A lovely retired priest encouraged me to lead Evensong, I trained as a Lay Reader. The Rural Dean suggested ordination and after several years of training, my lovely husband died.

A year later I was ordained, and I served my title at St Mary's Far Cotton, and then Guilsborough, and became Priest in Charge of the Walgrave Benefice, and then Rector of the Amelcote Benefice.

Here I am – finding walks with Austin my black Labrador.

My grandson has come to live with me, for a few months.

My son lives near lpswich with his wife and their son.

My daughter lives in Blaby, with her youngest son.

Her eldest son has just got engaged and lives in Nottingham,

I watch Northampton Saints RFC and enjoy cricket.

I love singing and enjoy most music, especially Jazz.

I look forward to meeting you, living in Culworth and becoming your Rector and friend.

Dedication of the Turret Clock, Chipping Warden



The Benefice Holy Communion at 11am in Chipping Warden Church was led by the Archdeacon of Northampton Ven Richard Ormston. It included the dedication of the restoration of the Turret Clock. Built in 1762 by Thomas Pinfold of Middleton Cheney, it ceased to function many years ago, laying dormant in the tower.

Martin Rowling, Churchwarden Culworth, and Ian Chapple from Whitfield offered to restore the clock but into a case viewed from the floor of the North Aisle.

The various participants (including a number of Culworth residents) in the clock refurbishment were;

Martin Rowling. All of the iron modifications and additions. The bell support and striking mechanism, the new leading off work, the dial frame and support, various cleaning of parts, the winder chain support, many small iron items, deep discussion and understanding.

Ian Chapple. Project management, dial numerals, hands, and motion work, electric winder concept and build, escapement rebuild, pinion rebuild.

Paul Brook Nolan. Sourcing the bell, many useful suggestions and help with the re-assembly.

Nigel Williams. For the beautiful oak cabinet to protect and display the clock.

A B Race Engineering of Wappenham for welding work on the clock pinions.

Watermans goldsmiths of Banbury for fine work on the escapement.

Michael Pringle (a personal friend of mine and expert wood turner) for beautiful woodturning parts.

Rev. John Roberts for bearings and precision metalwork on the going train and the motion work.

Rupert Rowling and Jonathan Howse for their exhausting morning making multiple trips transporting the parts of the clock downstairs.

Adrian Kilmister for his generous donation of the finished oak for the cabinet.

Those present were able to appreciate the flower festival using garden flowers and enjoy the delicious lunch and pimms.

The working clock is well worth inspecting.

Ride and Stride 2023, 9th September

The Northamptonshire Historic Churches Trust was founded in 1955 with the object of raising funds to make grants to churches in Northamptonshire of all denominations for their "preservation, repair and maintenance, improvement, upkeep, beautification and reconstruction". Grants are made to churches and chapels during the course of the year.

The Trust's funds are raised by donations, subscriptions from friends, and the proceeds of the annual sponsored Ride & Stride, which takes place on the second Saturday in September each year.

Ride and Stride was 'born' in Suffolk in 1982 as a sponsored cycle ride or walk and is held annually, in virtually every county in England. It is the main fund-raising event for the county churches trusts. It is now a sponsored event for cyclists, joggers, walkers and horse riders. Any mode of transport can be used as long as sponsors are happy; a couple of people have used vintage cars!

Ride and Stride is a countrywide event always held on the second Saturday in September. Money raised helps Northamptonshire Historic Churches Trust to continue supporting our marvellous churches across the county with essential repairs and improvements. Ride and Stride is an opportunity to raise money not only for the Trust but for your own church, as we return 50% of the money to the church of your choice.
