Parish Council News

A quarter of a million invested in our community!

The Council is delighted to have been able to authorise the signing of contracts to build the much-wanted Community play and exercise facility on the Hill Field, due to be constructed in the next few months. Along with Phase 1 of the Hill Field project, which is nearing completion and within budget, this brings the investment in the Hill Field on behalf of the community to around £250k over the last year. This investment has been funded by Sport England and HS2 with matchfunding from the Village Hall Trust, the Cricket Club and the Parish Council. The work has been delivered by the Culworth Hill Field Trust and Activate Culworth working in partnership with the Parish Council and shows what can be achieved when a community works positively together.

Culworth Community Park





This past month has evidenced our community's commitment and support in offering generous financial donations towards the project. Activate Culworth Community Group launched its Crowdfunding Campaign on 28th February - and at the time of writing we have raised £3,651 from 48 donors, exceeding our £3500 goal. Donations came both from residents of Culworth and the surrounding villages who will also enjoy the new facilities - and this should also benefit our local businesses. The crowdfunding page remained open until 28th March 2023.

A quiz night took place at Forge Coffee on 11th March raising £45 in ticket sales towards the project with a raffle running alongside which has already sold over 80 tickets worth approximately £200 (to be confirmed). Culworth Bingo night is being held at the village hall on Saturday 1st April. All places were reserved ahead of the evening; we estimate funds raised being in the region of £300-£500. On Tuesday 14th March Maddy and Karen met with the Culworth School CPSA to update them with the progress of the project. Maddy met with members of the Cricket Club at Forge Coffee on Saturday 18th March to listen to their feedback on the project.

We are extremely grateful to the Parish Council for their ongoing support and guidance. They continue to push this Community Park Project forwards and are currently in communication with the selected company Kompan around final contract details.

The sooner this community park is installed the better; all residents and visitors to Culworth will benefit.

Culworth Circular Walks



Want to walk round Culworth but can't find the right footpaths? On the first Tuesday of the month there will be a group walking round the Culworth footpaths. Each walk will last about 2 hours and will give those who are not sure of the footpaths a chance to see the lovely countryside where we live and have a chat with fellow villagers at the same time. Walks start at 10am from The Green.

There were 7 of us on the first walk in March. Dogs are welcome as long as they can get over the stiles. The next walks are on 4th April and 2nd May.

Vehicles for Ukraine

Last summer I made two trips into Ukraine delivering aid and then in December we took a four-wheel drive ambulance to a volunteer Norwegian medic in Kiev, then another vehicle to soldiers in Zaporizhzhia, not far from the front line. That Norwegian medic has since been badly wounded but is now back in action on the front line. What courage.

This experience of seeing a country and a people at war made me want to deliver a message to my friends and contacts. That message was simple. They could help Ukraine in many ways, including of course donations and aid, but also b supplying vehicles for the military and the front-line medics. This war is being fought by extraordinary soldiers who are short of equipment, and they use converted civilian vehicles every day. The life of these vehicles is short as their use is intensive and in terrible conditions.

My friends responded superbly to my appeal by donating money or vehicles. In January we took nine vehicles to Lviv in Ukraine in two convoys. Thanks to Jeremy at Culworth Garage for last-minute help.

My involvement in this has been due to the efforts of a remarkable young man, Fynn Watt, from Deddington, and his father Angus, who runs a car restoration business at Greatworth Park. Together they select suitable vehicles, organise the convoys and ensure they end up in the right place and in the right hands in Ukraine.

We are now putting together another convoy to go in April. If anyone in Culworth would like to support our activities in any way, please get in touch.

Obituary

Lynne Gottowik

Lynne was born in 1950 when we lived at Chipping Warden and was seven when we moved to Culworth. She was a pupil at the village school when Mr Knowles was Head and Miss Holloway his assistant. She later attended B.H.S.in Brackley and was nicknamed 'Gus' by her friends.

Lynne became a teacher (a good one, I'm told). At the beginning of her career, she moved to Hamburg. She was a member of staff at an International School there, teaching English to students from many diverse nations. When again she returned to her homeland she taught English as a Foreign Language (E.F.L.) and lived for a time in London, Yorkshire and also in Bournemouth.

Lynne was active in C.N.D. and joined the Greenham Common Women, undergoing with them the taunts and indignities they were subjected to. Her concern for animals found in her a keen supporter of Hillside Animal Sanctuary, The Sidmouth Donkeys, and more locally, Cat charities.

Lynne and her friend Jacqui canvassed this village to assess the need for a bus. This has now been accomplished, but they (and I) were pioneers in this respect although as residents of Bristol, they were not self-serving!

Long years ago, a villager known as "Old Ritchie" (who drove taxis when needed and knew her father Erich), seeing Lynne as a child remarked, "Bye! He'll never be gone while she's here", so his words resonate with me, her Mum, at this time.

Her ashes will, as she wished, join Erich's in Culworth churchyard.

The committal of Lynne's ashes will be accompanied by a celebration of her life, at Culworth Village Hall on Saturday 22nd April at 2pm. All are welcome



Culworth Hill Field Trust – Update

Overview: The work to realign the cricket pitch and install new practice nets and carry out repairs to the Cricket Pavilion has been completed. The Phase 1 Works to implement the current planning permission have also been substantially completed.

Phase 1 Works remaining:

- The installation of the bollards in accordance with the planning permission and entrance and exit signs. PC formal approval awaited to proceed with this work.
- The 'Crossovers' are subject to a Section 278 agreement and are currently being designed. The work is to be complete this year.
- The Cricket Club has arranged with a local farmer to remove the pile of subsoil at no cost. There was no provision in the original budget.
- The Cricket Club plan to use the pile of topsoil to level up the outfield. This will be done after the close of the cricket season.

The Parish Council is considering further fencing options around the building line of the new Community and Recreation Facility to help secure the Hill Field from vehicular access. There is no provision in the original budget.

The Parish Council is planning a hedging scheme on the Western and Eastern boundaries of the Hill Field.

Budget: The cost of all the works is expected to be completed, within the original budget of £159k. There are provisional sums in the budget for all of the remaining work above, except where indicated. We will review the latest cost report at our next meeting.

Next Steps: We will now consider all the options available for the new Community and Recreation facility on Hill Field in the context of the current economic and funding outlook and consult with villagers on the plans in due course.

JT welcomed Darryl Timmins (DT) & Catherine Ruffley (CR) to the meeting.

Apologies for Absence: There were none.

Minutes of the last meetings: These were signed as a true & correct record.

Matters Arising: Window blackouts- JMB has painted the windows, but they need one more coat.

Reported conflict of Interest: JT is on the Culworth Hill Field Trust and SP is representing the cricket club.

Co-option of new committee members: Catherine Ruffley was proposed by JMB and seconded by KH. Darryl Timmins was proposed by MW and seconded by JMB. The whole committee was in favour.

Chairman's Report: JT reported that we have a new regular user who is teaching sign language on a Monday evening.

The last film saw 40 people enjoying Mrs Harris goes to Paris. The Red Lion did the food. The next film night is February 17th and we will be showing Top Gun: Maverick.

JT said that the latest report from the CHFT committee has been published in the newsletter. JMB said there are ongoing discussions about how to secure the entrance and exit of the cricket field. JE would like our concerns passed on to the CHFT.

There is no longer any income from Culworth Snappers but £54 has been received from a new hirer for sign language courses.

MI informed us that the direct debit for the electricity hasn't been taken for 2 months.

MI now keeps the petty cash.

Business: Booking Clerk

Darryl Timmins has agreed to take over this role from June Oxley. He explained that all bookings are now available for any committee member to view online. MW will act as deputy booking clerk when DT is unavailable.

JT suggested that perhaps we ought to have our own hall website where all documentation could be viewed. JMB will ask for a quote for creating a website.

Whether a key safe was required was discussed and the general consensus was no as the code would need changing too regularly. Regular users have their own key but we need to make a list of who else has one.

MI is looking into online banking which would make everything easier for bookings.

Policies/H & S/Risk Assessment - We had a look at these and a few things still need altering/updating.

<u>Lights & Heaters - JMB</u> suggested looking into changing the tube lights and electric ceiling heaters to something more economical. He will get a quote.

<u>Bingo</u> - JMB is hoping to run another bingo evening and after some discussion the committee felt a good date would be April 1st.

Building and renewals: As part of the H & S policy we need to lock away cleaning liquids. JMB will put a lock on one of the kitchen cupboards for this purpose.

Any other business: DT asked about the capacity of the hall. It can hold 100 standing and 80 seated.

JMB mentioned that there will be a defibrillator training course soon, in the hall, with a maximum of 26 people. Donations for this event will go the air ambulance.

JT said that the bins will need to be put out weekly. DT & JMB offered to do this between them.

Tom Fields family have given the hall a donation. JT will write & thank them.

We have a form to fill in requiring information about the hall and set up in preparation for elections.

As June Oxley is no longer on the committee her signature will need removing from the bank. Currently the other signatories are MI and JT. MI suggested that SP be added but that will be discussed at the next meeting.

JMB reported that the new community park has been approved and they have received a grant from HS2 and a donation from the parish council. They still have a little bit more to raise and so there will be some fundraising events being held soon.
