## Ruby Humphrey, Culworth's Land Army Girl

Ruby Humphrey died a few months ago in Culworth, aged 101. The following article appeared several years ago in the Village Newsletter and is reprinted at the suggestion of Jenny Howse.

"Until the outbreak of World War 2 Ruby Humphrey had been in domestic service. Born in Bicester in 1921 she was living with her mother at Water Eaton when war broke out. She decided to join the Women's Land Army like several thousand other ladies, to do her bit towards the war effort. Having been provided with her uniform, she started her training with a farmer at Water Eaton, living at home. Following an injury to her wrist she spent a period of convalescence at Rest Break House in Torquay. This was the first time she had been on a train, and certainly the first time she had been horse riding or waited on by maids. The girls there were fed very well. She returned to Swacliffe, living in a hostel, picking vegetables and looking after the other girls, until she was fit enough to work on the farm again.

Ruby worked on several farms including ones at Colethorpe near Whitney, where she met her husband, Wilf, and Falcutt Hall near Helmdon. She remembers helping with the hay and building hay and straw ricks, working with the Clydesdale horses, harnessing them up to the cart. She had to balance standing up on the cart throwing out the mangolds for the sheep and cattle. The milk had to be taken for collection in large churns. Ruby remembers working here with another Land Girl and 6 male workers. Although the girls alternated each week between the dairy and outside jobs, Ruby wasn't very good at milking, all done by hand then of course. Sheep shearing was done with a 'Lister' machine and it was Ruby's job to turn the handle to make the machine work. She got extra rations during the shearing season. She also had to catch the sheep and put them in a dip.

Other jobs included mending fences and hoeing rows and rows of mangolds. It was a long day. Work started at 7.30 in the morning, finishing at 5 at night, with an hour for lunch. Ruby loved working on the land and even though she had signed on for 4 years she carried on working on the land another 4 years after that, although then she wasn't provided with that wonderful iconic uniform.

In more recent years Ruby could be seen cycling around Culworth going from job to job. She even cycled to Chipping Warden to help out with the potato harvest. Ruby has wonderful memories of her time as a member of the Land Army and at the age of 92 is still a very active member of the village."
