HM the QUEEN ELIZABETH PLATINUM JUBILEE 2-5TH JUNE 2022

Culworth Parish Council delegated the celebrations to a team led by Chairman Andrew Wilby.

Every resident was delivered an envelope containing the planned celebrations around Easter time to give residents good notice to participate. In it were invitations to the special events. A further booklet was delivered just fortnight before detailing each days events.

From Thursday onwards there was a flower festival in church with just anyone bringing a jar of flowers. It was glorious

There were old photos taken by the late Stan Bailey, an avid photographer recording events in Culworth, photographs of every house for the Golden Jubilee taken by George Cole. The archaeological dig, opening of the new Burial Ground, the refurbishment of the Church let alone the History of the Women's Institute as Her Majesty is President of Sandringham WI. Martin Rowling had worked out a timeline for the church. A team has started to put together a timeline of the village. Rosy's special handwriting enhances the work. The last two remain in the church for some while along with the photographs of the village today taken by Culworth Snappers. Thursday 2nd June from about 9.15pm, a skilled band of bellringers from Towcester welcomed the start before the Bonfire was lit in fullview of the Cricket Field. Thanks to Vernon and Lizzie Phipps, Stuart Rolt, Andrew Field and David Smith, a large number of residents welcomed the lighting of the bonfire about 9.45pm. In the beautiful night sky the bonfire provided the Culworth Snappers the opportunity for some good photos.

Friday 3rd June The Civic Service was held at 6pm in St Mary's Church. The Towcester and local bellringers welcomed everyone to the service which was led by Rev Mike Chesher with Jenny Howse at the organ in the presence of Rupert Fordham Deputy Lord Lieutenant of Northamptonshire, and Dr Nicola Trott, members of the Parish Council, the Village Hall Trust, Culworth Cricket Club and residents making around 80 in the congregation. Gerald Cadogan,

Churchwarden Emeritus read the Proclamation. The Rector's well received sermon spoke of the Queen's loyal and devoted service to the country through all the ups and downs in life.

The collection for the New Community Building amounted to £320.60.

The whole village was invited to Forge Coffee for wine and canapes hosted by the Parish Council, Village Hall Trust, Culworth Cricket Club and the Parochial Church Council. During the evening, Andrew Wilby, Chair of Parish Council proposed the Loyal Toast to HM The Queen.

Saturday 4th June saw the scarecrow judges Jonathan Ruffley and scarecrow Martin Rowling touring the village enjoying the 25 very professional scarecrows. Many residents too enjoyed them Debbie Rolt and Mary Gribbin had a formidable task of judging the 29 gardens in the various categories. More of that separately. Many thanks for their time and thoughtfulness.

Jubilee cake competition was held in the Village Hall. Judges Catherine Ruffley and Kate Smith found judging 17 entries from young and old quite a tough task.

Sunday 5th June from 9am, the Green Party with trailers gathered Gazebos, tables chairs, benches and BBQ's to make the street party happen. With the road closure, it enabled the party to be held on the tarmac .In spite of inclement weather, from 12.30 onwards around 200 people gathered to enjoy their picnics with neighbours and friends. The Jubilee cakes were shared around. It was an historic occasion. Included among the residents were Lord Wilson of Culworth and his wife, our 100 year old and our 94 year old resident. Our oldest resident of 105years was given some flowers. The Loyal Toast was given by Andrew Wilby. This was followed by the prizegiving for the scarecrows, cakes and gardens. Music of 1950's was provided by Simon Martin, BBQs by Probets. It was a remarkably happy occasion. Thank you to all the Green team for their hard work in preparation and clearing up and to all the residents who joined in the fun.

News from St Mary's

Well, there is at least one thing I share with the Queen – we both share our Platinum Jubilee this year; the spring of 1952 saw the beginning of her



reign and the beginning of my life – but that's probably where the comparison ends! But what that means is that she has always been there, and that's probably one reason why, apart from the occasional royal scandal or wedding, I pretty much took her for granted. It's easy to overlook her qualities, as a both a leader and as a person. And though the Netflix series 'The Crown' probably did most of the royals no favours, on balance I don't think it did the Queen any harm; whilst leaked criticisms about it, such as Charles' description of it as 'sinister and sophisticated propaganda', the Queen came through in a clearer light. The portrayal of her wasn't always flattering, but it was honest enough to show her as a human being who had her personal struggles, who made mistakes, but who has qualities we surely all admire - the inner strength to survive them and to make amends. Public opinion is often cruel and heightened today by the social media platforms and the relentless pursuit of the press; but ultimately, if you have done nothing wrong, you have nothing to fear - and Queen Elizabeth, unlike most of her family, have survived this tempering by fire, and is someone who we can still feel respect and admiration for.

One thing she has had to bear is the resentment that many feel regarding her privileged status and life-style. And yet she did not 'seize' this privilege, and the wealth that came with it; it was placed upon her in an 'accident of birth', and it has been an undoubted twoedged sword; but few can deny how she has sacrificed a more normal life by her amazing commitment to her responsibilities – even at her advanced age. Although she is not, in a political sense, a leader, she has displayed leadership in a way that most, if not all, of our elected leaders during her reign, have not been able to, even for such short terms. She demonstrates that leadership is not about the power to enforce or impose, but the desire, and ability, to lead by example; her life has shown that integrity, genuine commitment, and a desire to serve, rather than be served, is the true mark of a leader.

CHFT PROGRESS BRIEFING NOTE 12th June, 2022

- 1. With the current economic outlook it is currently proving difficult to raise the funds to build the new Community and Recreation Facility. Realistically, the only way to do this is in phases and continue to do what we can to raise money and pursue potential funding sources over time.
- 2. It is our intention to start on site with the first phase, in the Autumn of this year, before the expiry of the existing planning permission on 19th December, 2022. Prior to the start of construction of Phase 1 Works, a marked up plan, will be displayed in the church and the Forge Coffee, in accordance with the existing planning permission. Phase 1 Works will consist of the following:
- a. The establishment of a new entrance;
- b. Modification of the exiting entrance;
- c. New gates in the style of the old gate for both the entrance and the exit;
- d. The establishment of a two-way drive (consolidated hard core);

- e. Car parking for the new facility (consolidated hard core).
- 3. Once Phase 1 works have been completed, we will apply to the planning authority for a 'Certificate of Lawful Development'. Once granted, this will give us confirmation that the existing planning permission has been implemented. If in future, we wish to materially change what we want to build, we will need to submit a new planning application, but the principle of development on this site will be established.
- 4. Following constructive discussions with SE we amended our original application for funding in order to be eligible for the funds they have available. SE have made and CHFT, have accepted, subject to contract, a grant of £109k to pay for the re-alignment of the cricket wicket, the installation of new cricket nets, interim repairs to the cricket pavilion and a contribution to Phase 1 Works, as per the table below.

- 5. CHFT have secured £35k of the match funding required from the Culworth Parish Council, The Village Hall Trust and the Cricket Club. We have a pending application to West Northhants., for a grant of £15k, which if successful, subject to the outcome of the tender process, have all the funds required to complete the project including Phase 1 Works.
- 6. SE require CHFT to commence the works asap and to have claimed all the money by 31st December, 2022. CHFT is seeking VAT advice to ensure the best possible outcome.

- 7. The part of the land (the cricket field, named as Hill Field to respect Mrs Trott's wishes to continue her family's connection with Culworth), on which planning permission for the new Community and Recreation Facility has been granted, was gifted by Mrs Trott for £1, to the PC. It was only "parked" with the PC because the CIO, (Culworth Hill Field Trust) had not been formally constituted at the time of the gift. We have asked the PC to grant us a long leasehold interest or transfer the freehold of this land, as originally intended, so that we can commence Phase 1 Works.
- 8. The Freehold of the remainder of the land, was owned by Mrs Trott and is now subject to probate. The PC have a Long Leasehold interest over that land(43 years remaining). The PC provides a license to the Cricket Club to use field and the pavilion during the cricket season. The PC have agreed to grant the CHFT a Tenancy at Will, subject to the license granted to the Cricket Club. This will enable CHFT to carry out the necessary works.
- 9. We have started the procurement and tender process to select contractors to carry out the work. We will if possible, subject to suitability, availability and price, use local contractors.
- 10. The Phase 1 works will bring real benefits to the Village Hall Trust, the Cricket Club, The church, the school and the village by providing much safer access to Hill Field than the existing access via Banbury Lane and will provide much needed 'off road' parking for events, which will help to relieve traffic congestion.



With the schools back we've tweaked our hours to cater for the morning drop off so we're now open: Mondays to Fridays 8:45am-4pm Saturdays 9am-4pm Sundays 9am-3pm
