Host of world class sport this summer



West Northamptonshire will showcase itself as a world-class sporting venue this summer when it welcomes back the prestigious Women's Tour.

The international cycling race will take place from 7-11 June, with Northampton hosting a stage start on Thursday 8 June. The route is set to run through West Northants, taking in parts of the Daventry and South Northants areas, with further details due to be announced in the coming months.

The Tour, which is televised globally, will form part of a wider programme of sport and wellbeing events and activities this summer, with residents, businesses, schools and community groups encouraged to get involved as plans take shape in the coming months.

Our Council is working with race organisers SweetSpot on bringing the world-famous



Events like this play an important role in bringing communities together and inspiring people to take up sport and live a more active and healthier lifestyle. They also provide a significant boost to our local economy. Alongside a programme of community events and activities there will also be opportunities for local businesses, including potential sponsorship of the event.

There will be lots of opportunities for Town and Parish Councils to get involved too, and we look forward to working with you on these as the route is confirmed and the planning progresses.

Our Council is also committed to doing everything possible to encourage and promote increased participation in sport by women and girls. By hosting an international event showcasing incredible female athletes we hope to continue breaking down barriers in the way that England's Lionesses and women's rugby team have in recent years.

In previous Women's Tours we have seen a record number of spectators visiting the area and lining the route to show their support – which we very much hope to witness again this year as we showcase our fantastic area to a worldwide audience.

Have a say on council boundary proposals

The number of West Northamptonshire councillors and voter areas are set to change the next local elections in 2025 under proposals by The Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE).

The LGBCE has published its proposals for changes to West Northants, which would see the number of wards increased from 31 to 34. Seven of those would be one councillor wards, 15 would be two councillor wards, and the remaining 13 would each be served by three councillors – amounting to 76 councillors in total.

A public consultation on the proposals has been launched, and people have until 15 May to have their say by visiting the LGBCE website

Following the first stage of consultation, we welcome the recommendations from the Commission and the outline proposals.

This next stage provides a great opportunity for everyone to have their say and help shape our future electoral landscape.

We want the best outcome possible for West Northamptonshire, so I would everyone to look at the plans and ensure their views help to shape the best outcome for our area.

West Northamptonshire Draft Recommendation wards

The review is expected to end in late 2023, once the LGBCE has made its recommendations to government and an Order is laid in Parliament to change the legislation and make the new electoral arrangements.

Shining a spotlight on rural community needs

Industry Northamptonshire Community Foundation (NCF) have launched a campaign to help shine a spotlight on rural community needs.

Nearly a third of the county live within rural communities and a recent report from the Rural Services Network reveals how the cost of living crisis is hitting people living in rural areas harder than those in towns and cities, with people living in the countryside having to pay far more on essentials such as heating, housing and transport.

The Shining a Spotlight on Rural Community Needs campaign aims to develop a focus on rural philanthropy to ensure these communities get their fair share of funding, helping tackle urgent needs such as poverty and access to services.

Throughout 2023, NCF will be holding a series of Community Conversations to look at local need and community solutions. Members are invited to get involved and help to tackle food and fuel poverty during the current energy crisis in rural communities.

The Coronation weekend from 6-8 May offers a wonderful opportunity for communities to come together and celebrate a significant occasion in our nation's history.

There are lots of different ways to get involved, including street parties and Coronation Big Lunches or volunteering during The Big Help Out to support local good causes, and I know many Town and Parish Councils will be putting on events too.

I hope to see many of our residents across West Northants taking this opportunity and encourage anyone looking to bring the Coronation celebrations into the heart of their own communities by getting involved.

Coronation events digital map

Parish councils and community organisations have been invited by the Government to **share how they will celebrate the Coronation on a digital map** which will be promoted in the months and weeks leading up to the Coronation.

Street parties and Coronation events

Those planning street parties with friends and neighbours over the Coronation weekend need to <u>apply for a temporary road</u> <u>closure here</u> There is no charge for making an application for an event taking place between 6-8 May. If you are planning a larger event in your town or parish area, you are urged to <u>let our</u> <u>Council know about the event</u> so we can check issues such as licensing, safety and traffic management.



Communities urged to get involved

Community groups, schools, artists and traders across West Northamptonshire are also being invited to support the local Coronation celebrations.

Our Council and Northampton Town Council are inviting local producers, schools, bands, creative makers, artists and traders to showcase their unique offer, including food, drink, arts and crafts, life music and performances as part of the Celebrations that will take place over the Coronation weekend from 6 to 8 May.

The weekend of celebrations will include street party-style activities and big screens in Northampton town centre on the Saturday between 11am- 5pm and a Coronation Big Lunch and Afterparty at Delaprè Abbey on the Sunday from 12pm - 10.30pm, ending with the Big Help Out on 8 May, which will highlight the impact of volunteering.

Planning systems are due to be migrated

The planning systems for the former Daventry and South Northants areas will be migrated into one new planning system on 3 April.

In order to enable the migration of hundreds of thousands of files, the old systems will be turned off on Friday 24 March, and reopened on the new system on Monday 3 April.

During this period, people will still be able to view and comment on planning applications and put in new planning applications in the Daventry and South areas via the Council's website. However the applications will not be processed until the week beginning 3 April.

A notice will be added to our website to notify people in advance, and we are working with both internal and external stakeholders to ensure they are aware of these works.



The Northampton area planning system will be moved onto the new central system in a second phase, expected to take place in mid to late June.

Teams have been working hard over the last two years in order to ensure we are able to move to one new centralised system which will help to provide a more seamless process for staff and our customers.

Success for intensive planning clearance week

An intensive clearance week in the planning team resulted in 125 applications being determined – around twice the average number of decisions usually made in a week.

A very high proportion of the applications were delegated cases with complex issues. The extra time and focus spent on them meant they could be approved, so not only were there twice as many decisions, but a lot of positive and proactive decision making was achieved.

The focus week was held from Monday 20 to Friday 24 February, when officers worked closely together to prioritise the processing of applications over other aspects of their work.

It was held as part of the service's ongoing proactive approach toward significantly reducing the time it takes to determine applications and provide responses.

Building Control services are changing

Plans are progressing to bring Building Control services back in-house to West Northants Council from 1 April 2023.

Back in 2015 the Building Control function for the former Daventry District Council was transferred to a shared service with Warwick and Rugby Councils.

Following the establishment of West Northants Council, work has been ongoing with partners, officers and stakeholders to bring this service back in house to enable a single consistent service to be provided across the whole of West Northants.

Subscribe to our garden waste service

As you will be aware, residents are currently being invited to sign-up for our optional, chargeable garden waste subscription service.

The annual subscription charge for the fortnightly service from April 2023 to the end of March 2024 is £55 per bin and people can subscribe via the link on our website

Residents also now have the option to sign up for an annual Direct Debit to save having to remember to renew every year. Residents who are unable to access the internet can subscribe to the service by phoning the council on 0300 126 7000.

Once households are signed up to the service, they will receive their new 2023/24 garden waste permit which they will be asked to stick on their garden waste bin. Any bins that have not subscribed will not be emptied after 4 April.



Alternative options

People who do not wish to sign up to the service have the option of composting their garden waste at home, either in a traditional compost heap or by purchasing a compost bin by visiting www.getcomposting.com and typing in their postcode to see offers available.

People can also recycle garden waste for free at any of our **household waste recycling centres**

Public Spaces Protection Order for Northampton area

Deadline for comments: Monday 17 April

People are being invited to have their say on proposals to extend to Northampton an order which encourages responsible dog ownership and prohibits smoking in certain public spaces.

Our Council is proposing to vary the Public Spaces Protection Order introduced in the Daventry and South Northants areas last year so that it also covers the Northampton area, with the additional requirement that dogs should be kept on leads in Northampton town centre and at Upton Country Park.

Extension to taxi licensing consultation

Deadline for comments: Sunday 23 April

Residents, businesses and professional drivers have been given more time to comment on our Council's draft Private Hire and Hackney Carriage Licensing Policy.

The draft policy sets out the driver, vehicle and operator standards for hackney carriages and private hire vehicles, focussing on improving standards and public safety.

The deadline for this consultation has been extended to Sunday 23 April to allow people more time to fully review it and consider their views.

The new services will start on 1 April, and will continue to deliver the IASS remit of providing free, impartial information, advice and support to children and young people with SEND and their families.

These services operate at arm's length from local authorities and clinical commissioning groups and are independently trained.

They provide practical, factual and impartial information advice and support to enable children and young people and their parents to participate fully in decisions about education, health and social care.
