On behalf of The Royal British Legion, I would like to thank everyone in the village that contributed towards the 2019 Poppy Appeal resulting in £845.41 being collected during the two weeks of the appeal. Special thanks go to The Red Lion, Mumfords Butchers, Culworth School and Forge Coffee for hosting collection boxes and to also David Mold for knocking on doors!

The British Legion was formed on 15 May 1921, bringing together four national organisations of ex-Servicemen that had established themselves after the First World War and the RBL are the country's largest Armed Forces charity, with 235,000 members, 110,000 volunteers and a network of partners and charities;

helping give support wherever and whenever it's needed.

The first ever Poppy Appeal was also held in 1921. The poppies sold out almost immediately and raised over £106,000; a considerable amount at the time. This money was used to help WW1 veterans with employment and housing.

Today the Legion's role is broad; From supporting veterans and their families in debt and emergency situations to providing breaks for service families, it's initiatives provide vital support for the Armed Forces community.

The same support is also available for those who are experiencing multiple challenges such as being out of work, dealing with mental health problems, financial issues and alcohol abuse.

The programme's flagship is the £27m **Battle Back Centre at Lilleshall** in the West Midlands, which provides sports and adventure activities designed to promote self-confidence and improve motivation to aid recovery.

## Dog News

The regular request for owners to pick up dog poo tends to get pushed to the back of this newsletter, but there are so many dog owners in the village, and there have been a number of incidents over the last few months, so it is being given more prominence this time. Reproduced here in full is the Kennel Club Dog Walking Code.

For safe and happy walks with your dog, and to avoid causing problems for others:

1. Ensure your dog is under effective control, which means:

You have a short lead with you and use it when needed (e.g. around livestock, near cliff edges or where signage requests it)

You do not let your dog off the lead unless you keep it in sight and close enough to come back to you on command.

2. Prevent your dog from approaching horse riders, cyclists, or other people and their dogs uninvited.

3. Keep your dog with you on paths or access land and don't let it stray into crops including fields of grass, fruit and vegetables.

4. Never let your dog worry or chase wildlife or livestock. Follow advice on local signs to reduce disturbance to plants and animals.

5. Stay SAFE around farm animals and horses:

Stop, look and listen before entering a field;

be aware of any animals present

Always keep your dog on a short lead

Find the safest route around animals, giving them plenty of space and using paths or access land where possible

Exit the area calmly and quickly if threatened, releasing your dog to make it easier for you both to reach safety.

6. Always bag and bin your dog's poo wherever you are. You can use any public waste bin or your bin at home.

7. Never leave bags of dog poo lying around, even if you intend to pick them up later. Containers and deodorised bags can make them easier to carry.

8. Ensure your details are on your dog's collar and it is microchipped, so you can be reunited quickly if it is lost.

Walking

9. Keep your dog's vaccinations and worming up to date. Ask your vet for more information.

10. Contact your local authority, or look out for signs, to get more information about what to do and where to go in your area.

This is general advice for dog walkers developed with input from:

Natural England, Natural Resources Wales, Kennel Club, Forestry Commission, National Farmers' Union, NFU Cymru, Ramblers, Ramblers Cymru, National Trust, Country Land and Business Association, Hampshire County Council, The British Horse Society and the British Mountaineering Council.

Please follow this guidance, for the wellbeing of all of the residents of Culworth.

As the newsletter was going to press, the media coverage continues to suggest that HS2 will happen, and that it won't. Stuart Rolt attends bi-monthly liaison meetings on behalf of Culworth and reports three items of interest following the last meeting in Towcester.

HS2 will be seeking input and comment on their design for the Lower Thorpe viaduct. They will hold a meeting at Thorpe, where designs will be shown and comments can be made by the public. HS2 architects and

designers will be present. They will be in touch with Thorpe and Culworth to advise of a date.

A compound will be built in the field near the Magpie where currently model aircraft are flown. This will have offices for white collar staff. On the same site will be a concrete batching plant.

Speed awareness devices for Culworth should be installed in April.

### **Parish Council Election in May**

Can I encourage residents to put themselves forward for election to the Parish Council in May. We have just had a vacancy caused by Colin Lamb's departure from the village, and it was very encouraging to have four applicants for his replacement. I hope those who applied will have another go in May, when all positions on the council will be open for election. Being a Parish Councillor is not as time consuming as some people think it is. We meet once every second month, unless there are particular planning issues that need a more urgent response.

If you are interested, there is a formal process that requires applicants to offer themselves by 8th April, and the election will be on May 7th.

On Thursday May 7th 2020 there will be Parish Council elections which anyone who is on the electoral roll that is over 18 years old or who owns or tenants land within the Parish or whose main work is in the Parish can apply for nomination.

Nomination forms will be available from South Northants Council or via the Clerk to the Parish Council. Each person must be proposed and seconded by persons who are electors of this parish. The nominee must sign the form. The completed forms MUST be returned to South Northants Council at The Forum by a certain date and time. No late nominations are accepted.

The Returning officer for South Northants Council is in charge of the elections. The Polling station, usually the Village Hall is open from 7am to 10pm. Electors can apply for a postal vote if they prefer.

The result of the election may be known the next day. Parish Council meetings are held bimonthly currently on a Tuesday night at 7pm. The meetings last about an hour. Councillors receive an agenda and other papers three clear days before a meeting. There may be need

for extra meeting to discuss and submit Parish Council comments on planning applications.

The first meeting after the election is the Annual General Meeting when officers are elected for the forthcoming year.

The Minutes of the last AGM were signed as correct.

1. Matters Arising; None.

2. Chairmans Report: Thank you to all members of the Committee for their hard work and support during the year. Jane Field stood down as Treasurer at the AGM last year but stayed on in the position until we had found a replacement. Mark Izzett was co-opted onto the Committee as Treasurer on 15<sup>th</sup> January this year. Michelle Koster resigned as Parish Council representative at the PC meeting on 14<sup>th</sup> May due to time restraints. Martin Rowling took over the role on a temporary basis. The film and supper nights continue to be popular social events for those in the village and surrounding area and provide extra funds for the Village Hall. we have shown the following films- The Children's Act, King of Thieves, First Man, Stan and Ollie, Bohemian Rhapsody, Fisherman's Friend, Mary Queen of Scots and Johnny English Strikes Again. I would like to thank those who helped prepare the suppers for the film nights, we are very grateful for their help. Jenny Howse organised two frugal lunches again this year in March and also another well attended Shrove Tuesday Quiz. Regular events in the hall, Pilates, Snappers Camera Club, T'ai Chi, Coffee and Chat, Circle Dance and the monthly village cafes together with hirings all contribute to the running costs of the hall. The Village Hall Committee decided to abolish the historic two hour minimum hire fee making the hall more competitive for short hirings. There was no village fete this year. We hosted the Harvest lunch in the hall which was well attended and enjoyed by all, the proceeds going to the Church Roof Fund. The Culworth Hill Field Trust, set up to oversee the design and build of the proposed new hall, submitted final plans to SNC in April. We are still waiting for approval. Funding applications are continuing but without planning approval it is difficult to proceed. The Village Hall Trustees have decided how to market the existing Village Hall site and who to appoint to do this in readiness. We have continued to care for the Hall to provide a useful space for the village.
3. Treasurers Report: The Accounts for the year are attached. The amount in hand is £24550 (which includes £5K from the estate of Brian Harris) which is a drop of £609 on last year mainly due to the legal fees incurred in the preparation of selling the original VH site in the future.
4. Nomination of Village Representatives and Trustees: It was proposed by JT and seconded by JE that these should stay the same, namely JE, MR, SP, MW. Carried unanimously.
5. Election of Officers: It was proposed by MW and seconded by JE that these also should remain as JT, Chair, MI, Treasurer and JO as Secretary. JT welcomed Kirsty Hawkins (KH) as a new member of the Committee, she was proposed by SP and seconded by JT. Carried unanimously.
6. Hiring Rates: There was a unanimous decision that these should stay the same.
7. Review of Health and Safety and Risk Assessments: The Health and Safety forms were taken by JT to be amended and updated to include a warning of hot water from the boiler tap in the kitchen ( SP) and the provision of socket covers on all sockets (SP). The First Aid Kit was examined and left for another year. JT will contact ACRE for a more up to date Health and Safety Policy. JO to obtain a new exercise book for the Defect/Damage log.
8. Equal Opportunities Review: Although we do have a policy it was felt the it should be brought up to date, JT to contact ACRE.
9. Repairs and Renewals: The front roof may need repairing, JT will contact Steve Law to advise. A replacement cooker has been donated to replace the existing one in the kitchen which does not work properly and JT will ask Mark Mumford to connect it and provide a PAT test on all the other appliances.
10. AOB: MI informed the Committee that the VH Insurance is up to date as advised by Allied Westminster.

The next meeting was fixed for Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> January 2020 at 7pm  
There being no other business the meeting closed at 9pm.

### **Byfield Medical Centre**

Following a show of support for the medical centre by about 400 people at the planning meeting at Daventry District Council, a final decision on the building of a new surgery and 78 houses has been deferred to allow the Council to gather more details about some of the proposals and consider any conditions that would allow them to recommend approval.



The authority also urged the developer to reach agreement with the highways department at Northamptonshire County Council, which had objected to the scheme in its current form.

### **HOPE CENTRE Northampton**

The centre near Campbell Square police station caters for those in the night shelter without accommodation by providing beds, food, washing facilities and the chance to regain their self-esteem. It is a very caring centre. People can be rehoused and employment opportunities found.

People in Culworth are very kind and supply toilet rolls, paper towels, towels, soap, shaving creams, razors, cleaning materials, warm clothes and bedding. Male socks and pants are urgently required. Ladies sanitary wear is needed.

There is a box in the church for any items of food too. Pasta, sugar, tea, biscuits, tea, coffee, soup, baked beans, cereals- any non-perishable food is welcomed. Please leave any items in the church or at The Forge. Many thanks. Jose

### **Bus Service**

Ability runs a weekly service, allowing people to get to Banbury for shopping, health or leisure purposes. It picks up passengers from agreed locations in the villages. It departs at 9:30am from Eydon, then to Culworth and Thorpe Mandeville, arriving at Banbury at approximately 10:30. It allows a couple of hours in Banbury (dropping off at the Bus Station in Banbury) before returning to Culworth, Eydon and Thorpe Mandeville
